INET Kuala Lumpur	<p>INET Kuala Lumpur was held on July 20th, 2009 at the Berjaya Times Convention Centre, Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. This was the first INET in Asia, and is part of the Internet Society's INET series of regional conferences.</p> <p>The conference was themed around "IPv6: the next step" and featured local, regional and international speakers sharing the perspectives on the current state of IPv6 and what needs to be done to move forward with wider deployment.</p> <p>Based on a survey of conference delegates, attendees found the range of speakers and their perspectives highly valuable. One of the key points highlighted was the importance of IPv6-specific training and the general lack of a skilled pool of engineers.
