"Space" for APAC Community Members


- "Practice Ground" to facilitate community discussion -> Participate in ICANN

APAC Space Subgroups

- Purpose of subgroups:
 - Facilitate deeper community discussions
 - Help inform community of policy issues related to ICANN
 - Allows community to raise issues quickly
- Responsibilities
 - In-depth discussion on selected topic
 - Present on topic during APAC Space to share discussion with wider APAC community
 - Recommend subject matter experts if required



DNS Software Developers & Distributors

System Integrators

Network Operators

Root Server Operators

Internet Service Providers

End Users
(if no action taken by resolver operators)



What Do Operators Need to Do?



Be aware whether DNSSEC is enabled in your servers



Be aware of how trust is evaluated in your operations



Test/verify your set ups



Inspect configuration files, are they (also) up to date?



If DNSSEC validation is enabled or planned in your system

- Have a plan for participating in the KSK rollover
- Know the dates, know the symptoms, solutions
