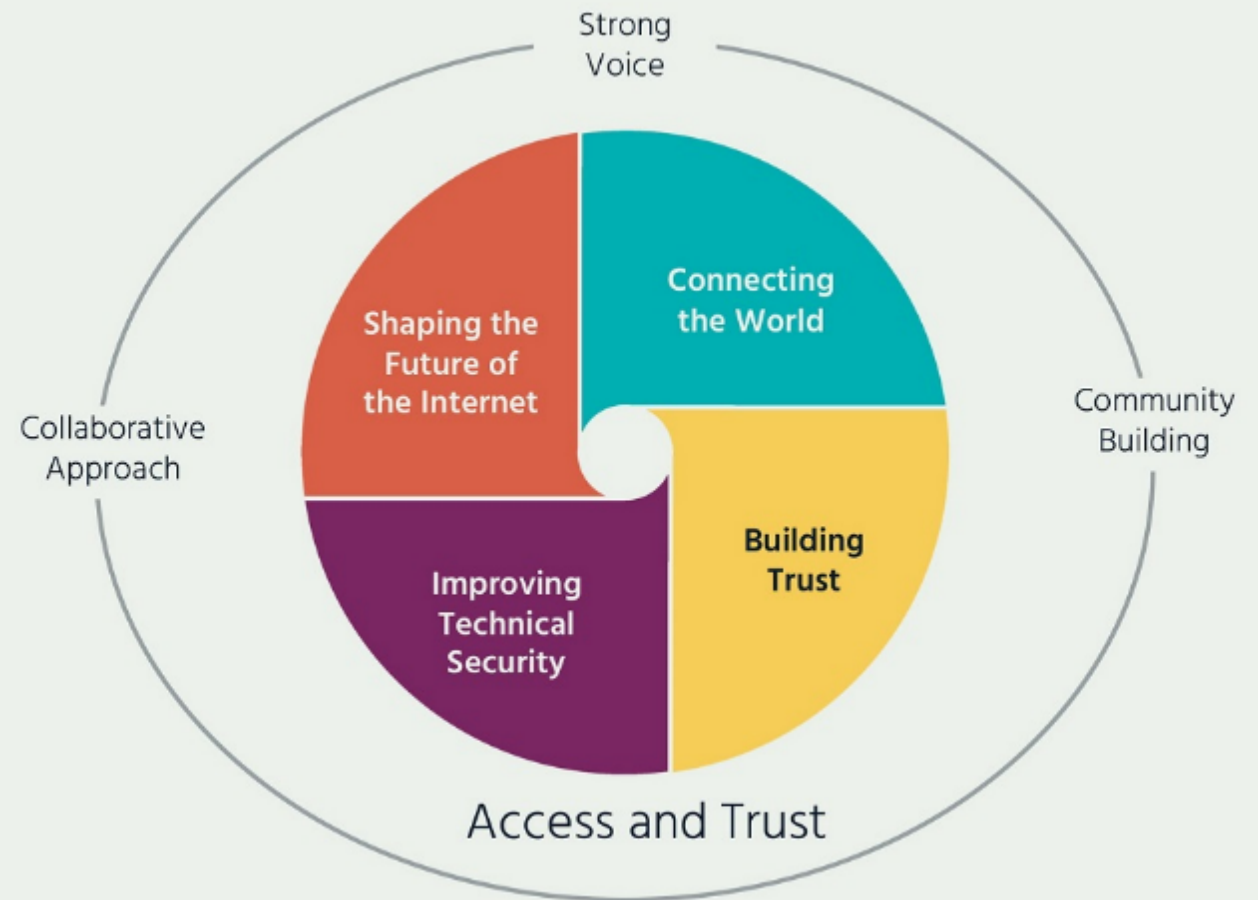
# What we are doing in 2019

# National ICT Ecosystem Framework (NICTEF) of the Philippines

- A five-year ICT masterplan (successor to the Philippine Digital Strategy 2011-2016) launched in Feb
- A multi-stakeholder model developed by Internet Society & the Department of ICT
- An inclusive, bottom-up approach that lets people set the agenda and goals of the country's digital strategy
- “Going beyond open public consultations”
- Developed with stakeholders from diverse sectors in dialogues and discussions
- A living document: plans and projects are updated periodically as the government continually considers comments from society

## Asia-Pacific Chapters & SIGs Workshop 2019

- 19 representatives from 14 local Chapters in Asia-Pacific gathered in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, for a two-day workshop in June
- An annual event that lets us strategise what local actions to take to amplify our voice and promote the organisation's mission – *the Internet is for Everyone*
- Emphasis on training and leadership in ISOC's focus areas, including IoT security, routing security, community networks, and Internet Governance



# APAC Community Networks Summit

- Jointly organised by United Nations ESCAP (Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific) and the Internet Society on Aug 29, 2019
- A one-day programme as part of UN ESCAP's Asia-Pacific Information Superhighway (AP-IS) Committee Meeting
- More than 20 speakers from government, business, academia, and community network operators; 26 member states
- Topics included:
  - Current status in APAC
  - Policy and regulatory barriers
  - Connectivity & the SDGs
  - Regulation and innovative approaches to spectrum licensing
  - Future of CNs in APAC

# Survey of Internet Policy Issues in Asia-Pacific

- Launched in 2014, our annual study gathers the views of Internet stakeholders towards topical Internet policy concerns in the region
- On average, over 2,000 responses per year from around 40 economies
- 2019 theme: Consolidation in the Internet economy
  - As a global infrastructure, the Internet is also shaped by economic and policy forces
  - We work to ensure changes do not undermine the key attributes that have allowed the Internet to thrive over the past three decades
- To be released in Sep 2019



## And more...

We partnered with APT to hold a 3-day Internet Governance Training Workshop for over 30 officials of Myanmar's Ministry of Transport and Communications in June



We were at the ITU Global Symposium for Regulators (ITUGSR) in Vanuatu to find new ways to connect underserved remote, rural, and urban communities to the Internet in July



In Aug, we led several sessions at the Asia-Pacific Internet Governance Academy, a weeklong training workshop for students between the age of 18 and 35 from universities in APAC



In July, ISOC's APAC lead Rajesh Singh chaired the APriGF in Vladivostok, Russia, and we moderated several workshops and sponsored fellows to the regional IG event
